Not only did they make the games, but they put them on display for the public, and even pitched their games complete with business plans—to a panel of industry professionals.

These pizza-fueled Imagine High game developers showed tremendous poise, skill, and professionalism as they battled sleep deprivation in order to meet the strict deadline. Ultimately, our students created 7 different games that went on display for the public arcade.

### FEBRUARY IS SCHOLARSHIP SEASON FOR GRADE 12'S! DISTRICT APPLICATIONS: DUE FEBRUARY 13, 2025 @ NOON.

<u>Link to apply</u> opened January 27 and closes promptly on February 13th at noon. No late applications will be accepted

STEP 1: Look through the <u>Awards Listing Descriptions</u>. (This can also be found on Teams or Imagine website)

STEP 2: Download the <u>Checklist</u> and save Lastname\_Firstname\_Checklist Complete and fill in the Checklist. Apply only for those awards for which you meet the criteria.

STEP 3: Download the <u>District Application Form</u>. Lastname\_Firstname\_ Name of Award Save and complete Word document.

STEP 4: Download the district <u>Reference Form</u>. You will need to have 2 references filled out and added to your application.

STEP 5: Organize Documents and apply via the <u>forms link</u>:

- Upload completed checklist with name, student number, and career goal filled out on right side. Any affiliations should be noted on the first page of your application.
- Make sure you save using Lastname\_Firstname\_Checklist
- Upload Completed Financial Awards Applications Form Including a Career Statement, Activities Resume, and Budget. This is called the District Application Form. Make sure you save using Lastname\_Firstname\_Name of Award and have downloaded school transcripts with a blackout PEN Number followed by your two reference forms- Ideally from both school and community, and then any additional essays that may be required.

Note: Information on how to complete the Career Statement, Reference Forms and Activities Resumes can be obtained through examples on Teams or from seeing the Career Advisor in the Career Centre.**Submit your application as early as possible so that we can catch any problems and correct them before the deadline. 

#### INTEGRATED PAIRINGS

At the Grade 11/12 level, students are offered Integrated Pairings. These pairings merge the content from two subject areas and provide students an opportunity to go deeper into projects. Pairings are worth 8 credits towards the Graduation Path, and are taught collaboratively by a team of two teachers. Pairings vary yearly based on student interest.

## **IMAGINE LIBRARY**

The library has just launched a bunch of Reading Challenges to help students make reading a priority in 2025! Students can come down to the library and peruse the variety of Reading Challenges available to them. Some example reading challenges are: "Read a book that was given to you as a gift", "Read a book with a One Word title", and "Read a book with a flower or plant on the cover". For each Reading Challenge that students complete in a month, they earn themselves an entry into a monthly draw for three gift certificates to The Bookman! Some challenges are bigger than others; those challenges reward readers with multiple entries into the draw. Entries stay in the pool all year so if you missed out the first time around then you still get a chance the next time around!

To help students find the perfect read, we have been pulling out some gems from the stacks to highlight. ### UNIVERSAL DESIGN FOR LEARNING: TRANSFORMING CLASSROOMS AT IMAGINE HIGH




At Imagine High, Universal Design for Learning (UDL) creates inclusive, dynamic, and studentcentered classrooms. UDL empowers teachers to design lessons that meet the needs of all learners, regardless of ability, background, or learning style. For example, in English classes, students might explore a novel through various formats—reading the text, listening to an audiobook, or analyzing a graphic novel adaptation. These choices help students engage with the material in ways that resonate with their individual learning preferences.

Imagine High teachers also use UDL principles to provide multiple ways for students to access content and demonstrate their understanding. In a science class, students might learn a concept through hands-on experiments, videos, or interactive simulations. To showcase their learning, they could build 3D models, create an explainer video, or present their findings in a traditional lab report. Similarly, math teachers use visual aids, manipulatives, and digital tools to ensure all students grasp complex concepts. By integrating UDL, Imagine High fosters an inclusive environment where students feel supported, valued, and empowered to succeed.

Professional Cook 1: Imagine High – Grade 12 (Full Year)

Transportation: Students are responsible for their own transportation to IHSS
Equipment, Textbooks & Other Fees: approx. \$850 for textbooks, supplies, uniform & knives (subject to change)

#### Youth TRAIN in Trades Program Objectives:

Certification Received: Professional Cook - Level 1

Skilled Trades BC Youth TRAIN in Trades is an industry certification program for BC secondary school students. The program enables students to earn both graduation credits and credit for the first level of technical training associated with a *Skilled Trades BC* program or apprenticeship. Through Practicum placements, students can also earn credit toward the on-the-job component of a *Skilled Trades BC* program. This is an opportunity for high school students to get a head start on earning their credentials in a trade recognized by *Skilled Trades BC*.

#### Prerequisites

- Must be a registered student in the Chilliwack School District
- Must be 15 years of age to begin and 19 years of age before program completion
- Completion of all Grade 11 courses
- Completion of English 12 & Indigenous Grad Requirement (course may vary)
