### **VIDEO GAME DEVELOPMENT AT IMAGINE**

If you walked by Imagine on Tuesday morning, you might have noticed an army of Grade 4 and 5 students descending upon the Computer Lab. Their goal: to talk about video games. While this may not sound like your average day in high school, it was an important part of our Computer Programming class, where students are not just learning to make video games they're learning to think like video game developers.

In December, Imagine students have been designing video games for a target audience of pre-teens. They wrote, filmed and directed 30-second pitches (like commercials), and they got to try out their ideas on a live audience.

Imagine High game developers "pitched" their game ideas to a real, live audience. Then, they met in focus groups of 5-6 students at a time to go deeper into their ideas, to ask questions, and to get detailed feedback. Now, our Imagine High game developers will have three weeks to turn these ideas into games. And when they're ready, we'll invite our friends at Leary to serve as playtesters, providing yet another round of important critique before we publish our final projects. It's a lot of work, but it's worth it, because at Imagine we aren't just committed to using professional tools; we're also committed to thinking and acting like professionals.

Deep Dives are dynamic and engaging, immersive learning institutes that offer opportunities for students to go deep into interests within specific art and technology focus areas. During the institutes, students collaborate with peers, teachers, experts, and community creatives to partner on real-world projects and problems. These intensive learning opportunities support students to hone in on personal passion areas, prepare for internships/work experience, and learn with industry-standard tools. During Deep Dive Institutes, learning in the integrated core and elective sessions are paused.

Offerings change yearly based on student interest. This round we had: Game Jam, Videogame Music, Imagine Pixels, Bussin' Photography, Acoustic Groove, Stage Makeup, Self-Directed Shopcraft, Art Studio, Fairytales & Mythology, Outdoor Education, Palaeontology, Philosophy & Film, Broadway Choreography, Boardgame Development, and Personal Passion Projects













# FIND SUPPORT BC - TRANSITIONS TIMELINE

School District 33 is determined to support students in finding "meaningful pathways, throughout secondary school and beyond graduation, including post-secondary, apprenticeship, college and workplace." In support of this, the District also offers multiple bridging programs that offer training and apprenticeships that students can take in grade 11 and 12. Our high schools have been working to include whole-school Career Days to help students prepare for post-secondary occupations and programs. December 2nd marked Imagine's second Career day and students were bussed to the Abbotsford Education Fair to hear from well-known universities colleges, trades institutions, and professional organizations about career opportunities. For our students with Individual Education Plans, we have been working to provide specific Transition goals that address what steps need to be taken to be successful before and after graduation. Transitions can be scary, and we want to prepare our students and families to the best of our abilities to feel confident and excited about their future.

This month we also wanted to highlight an awesome family resource to use when determining transition supports for your kids. The Family Support Institute of BC offers a number of different toolkits and downloadable resources on topics such as advocacy, education, financial literacy, and housing. They also offer a visual checklist, the "Find Support BC- Transitions Timeline" with information about what families can do for their child at different stages of development. This includes information on applying for a Social Insurance Number, opening a bank account, and applying for disability benefits. # **IMPORTANT CAREER CENTRE INFORMATION**

#### Grade 10-12 Post-Secondary Schools

Any parent or student looking for information to guide them in making the best postsecondary decisions can look at two sites available to help connect students with their best education opportunities. <u>Post Secondary BC</u> and <u>Education Planner BC</u> are tools that allow students to explore and make informative decisions regarding their postsecondary options.

#### **Grade 12 School Applications and Transcripts**

Students applying to BC post-Secondary institutions should create an account on <u>Education Planner BC</u>. On this site many institutions have direct links to program requirements and how to complete on-line applications. Grade 12 students are also encouraged to sign up early for the <u>Ministry of Education Student Transcript Service</u> (STS). The ministry has created a system where all students must have their own BCeID Account in order to access their transcripts for viewing or ordering. Students may add post-secondary schools to their account anytime up to July 10, 2025.

Students receive 25 selections free of charge while they are current students. Once students have left high school there will be a charge of \$10 per transcript payable on the student transcript service site.

#### Self-Reporting Grades

Self-Reporting is the process of submitting your grades electronically to an undergraduate admissions office so they can give you a timely admission decision. These deadlines vary per Post-Secondary School, so please check your emails for deadlines.

- **District Award Applications due February 13, 2025, by noon** : Applications are now available on Teams/Imagine High Website. Please check Student Teams under files in your Imagine High Grad Team Account or on the Imagine High Website under Graduation. Save a copy of your application to your computer, naming it your lastname\_firstname\_Name of Award.
- Complete the Financial Awards application form. The application is a fillable Word document. Please complete the application on your computer using Word. Using other computer applications will result in different formatting. Handwritten applications are difficult for our donors to read. If you must do it by hand, please do not use a pencil.
